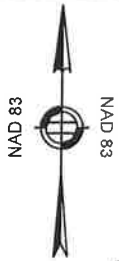

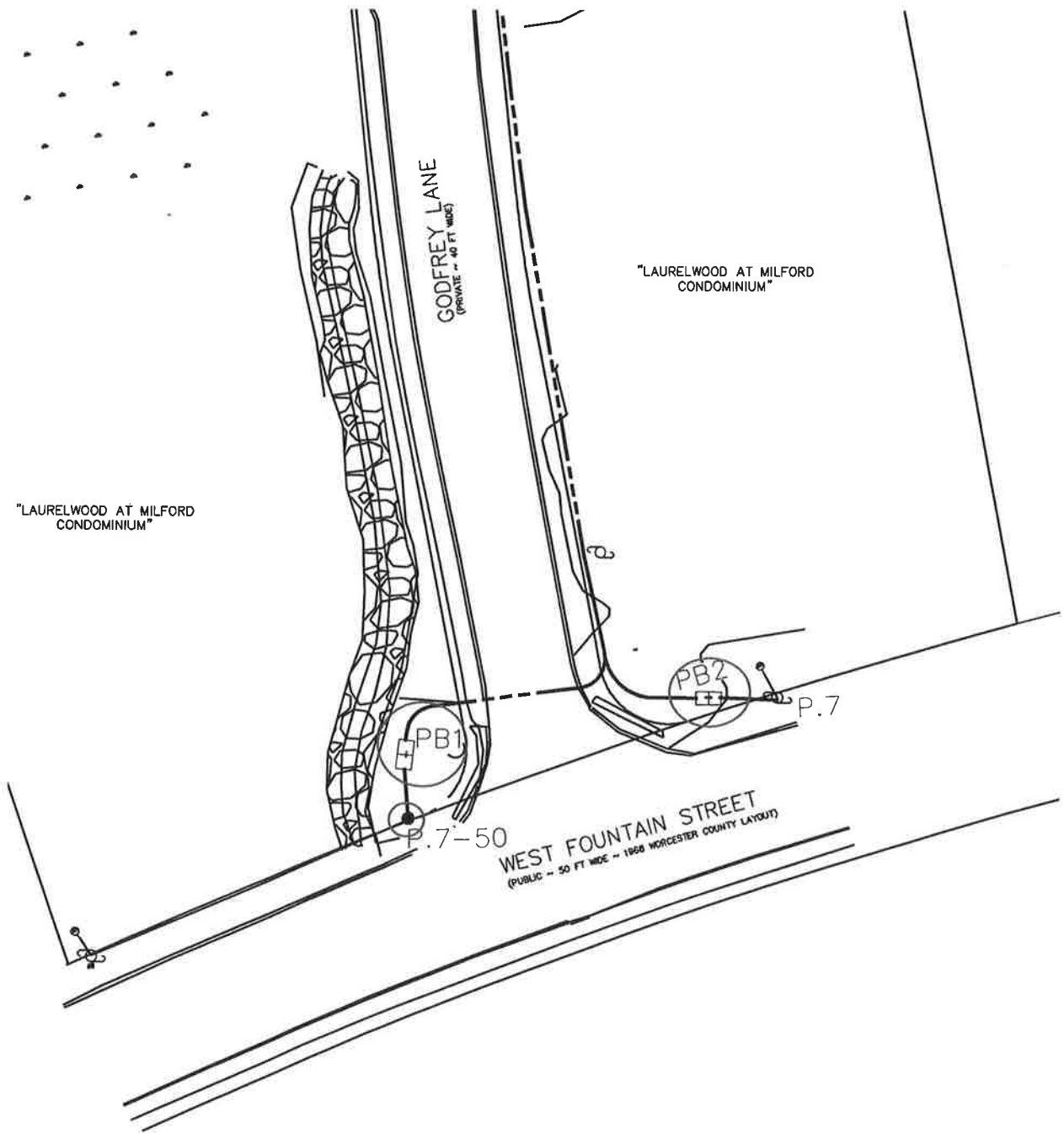

SUBJECT: **Update on Advanced Green Light** at the Intersection of Medway Road (Rt. 109)
and Beaver Street

This information is to serve as an update following the June 12, 2019 Memo, regarding the signalization at the intersection of Medway Road (Rout 109) and Beaver Street.

MassDOT has authorized a 9 to 10 second advanced green light which ultimately is a Delayed Red Light for the opposing traffic (9 to 10 seconds). MassDOT does not believe the minimal delay will cause any major issues with the traffic associated with the off ramps from Route 495.

There has been a complete design of the intersection to accommodate the new advanced green light (Attached). This new design requires reprogramming existing traffic signal controller, one new traffic signal pole and base, new signal lights, new conduit (under the pavement and in the intersection) and other accessories associated with the new system. This design has been completed by working with the developer of the Milford Crossing Shopping Center, RD Management at no cost to the Town.

Early this week emails have been sent to the Milford Police Department (Paul Pinto) and their traffic consultant who performs general work on the traffic lights throughout the Town. The plans were sent to the police departments consultant to see if the information contained in the new design plans (the phasing of the controller) is adequate enough to simply change the phasing to an advanced green light (9 to 10 seconds) until the major work (referenced above) takes place. The contact at the town's consultant is on vacation currently, Paul Pinto is reaching out to see if there is another person at the company that can evaluate the plans, if not, communication will resume next week.

RD management has always been responsive and once again prepared the design plans for the intersection. The last few emails were specifically regarding: the construction schedule of the proposed improvements in Beaver Street (left turn lanes into the new Plaza) and if RD Management is planning on paying for and performing the work in the intersection (for the advanced green light).

The following is the most recent response from the developer:

“Mike:

I spoke to Tom Quinlan yesterday about getting signal contractor proposals.

Tom is to call you with the update.

We do intend to proceed with the signal modifications as per World Tech plans.

We are also looking into contractor proposals for doing the dedicated ~~left~~ right turn lane into our shopping center along Beaver Street.

Tom will contact you on Monday if he has not already done so.

The above response appears the developer is going to perform the work.

Attached are only some of the sheets from the complete set of the design plans. Sheets 7 & 8 are the plans that are associated with the work in the intersection.

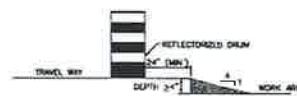

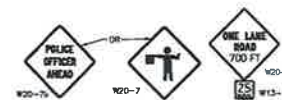

Kimberly and Samantha Dexter v. John and Melissa Seaver

A hearing was held on June 25, 2018 pursuant to G.L. ch 140, sec. 157, upon written complaint of Kimberly Dexter and Samantha Dexter, of 9 Debbie Lane, Milford, dated May 21, 2019 alleging vicious disposition and a disturbance and annoyance by a dog owned or harbored by John Seaver and Melissa Seaver of 7 Debbie Lane, Milford.

The foregoing matter came before me, designated to be Hearing Officer, by vote of the Board of Selectmen on July 11, 2016, at the Milford Town Hall. The hearing commenced at 5:00 PM. Several persons were present including Kimberly Dexter, Samantha Dexter, John Seaver, Melissa Seaver and Animal Control Officer Rochelle Thomson. All were sworn in by myself.

Documentation on file, which has become part of the record, is as follows:

1. Complaint of vicious or barking dog, Kimberly and Samantha Dexter, dated May 21, 2019.
2. Photo of dog bite on the arm of Samantha Dexter.
3. Photo of dog named "Grace."
4. Medical Record from Cummings Veterinary Medical Center dated January 21, 2017.
5. Correspondence from Milford Animal Control dated June 21, 2019.
6. Milford Animal Control Incident Report dated January 21, 2017.
7. Milford Animal Control Incident Report dated May 8, 2019.
8. Letter from Milford Animal Control to Samantha Dexter dated January 25, 2017.
9. Letter from Milford Animal Control to Samantha Dexter dated May 9, 2019.
10. Two (2) Photos of property at 7 Debbie Lane, Milford.
11. Letter from Milford Animal Control to John Seaver dated May 31, 2019.
12. Dog License for dog named "Caesar" dated June 10, 2019.
13. Letter from Milford Animal Control to Mr. and Mrs. Beaudrot dated June 19, 2019.
14. Written Statement form John and Melissa Seaver

Kimberly Dexter testified that Samantha Dexter was walking their dog Grace, who was on a leash, on January 17, 2017 when a dog owned by John and Melissa Seaver named Caesar ran from the Seaver's yard at 7 Debbie Lane, charged and attacked Grace and bit her in the chest. Samantha attempted to pull Caesar off of Grace and Caesar bit Samantha on her forearm. The bite resulted in a permanent scar. Melissa Seaver chased Caesar through the Dexter backyard at 9 Debbie Lane and took Caesar inside her home. Kimberly took Grace to Cummings Veterinary Medical Center to be treated for

punctures and lacerations. She stated the Seavers paid the Vet bills incurred for the treatment for Grace.

Kimberly further testified that on May 8, 2019 she and Samantha heard a dog barking and growling and heard individual voices yelling outside their home. She then observed Caesar being pulled out of the street by Melissa Seaver. She further observed a neighbor, Steve Beaudrot, was crouched beside his dog named Indi. Kimberly went outside. Mr. Beaudrot stated that Caesar charged at his dog as they were waling near 9 Debbie Lane. Caesar was not on a leash. Melissa Seaver got control of Caesar and took him to their home.

Samantha Dexter testified she is concerned about walking out of her front door as Ceasar charges towards dogs without stopping.

John Seaver testified Caesar is a Golden Retriever and is 8 years old. He said they never had any issues until the Dexters' moved in three weeks earlier. He agreed with Kimberly's testimony as to the incident on January 21, 2017. He said he is putting up a fence to resolve any issues. He further testified that Steve Beaudrot's dog Indi was not bitten by Caesar and he believed it is an isolated incident.

Melissa Seaver testified that on May 8, 2019 she let Caesar out for about 10 minutes. Caesar moved his hitch about 20 feet which allowed him longer leash access. Caesar broke off the hitch and ran into the street towards Beaudrot's dog. She said Caesar wears a Halti collar and training collar when on walks.

Kimberly further testified she is concerned about future incidents involving Caesar.

Rochelle Thomson, Animal Control Officer, testified if the Dexters requested a Hearing after the January 21, 2017 incident then Caesar would likely have been deemed a "dangerous dog."

The hearing closed at 5:36 PM.

Findings of Fact

Based upon the credible evidence presented, I make the following findings of fact:

1. Samantha and Kimberly Dexter reside at 9 Debbie Lane, Milford.
2. Samantha and Kimberly Dexter are the owners of a named "Grace."
3. John and Melissa Seaver reside at 7 Debbie Lane, Milford.
4. John and Melissa Seaver are the owners of a neutered male golden retriever, age 8, named "Caesar."
5. On January 21, 2017, the dog, Caesar, attacked the dog Grace, suddenly and without provocation and severely bit Grace on the chest, causing a severe laceration which required medical treatment.

6. On January 21, 2017, the dog, Caesar, bit Samantha Dexter as she was trying to pull Grace away from Caesar. The bite on Samantha's forearm resulted in bruising and a permanent scar.
7. On May 8, 2019, the dog Caesar was not on a leash and attacked the dog Indi, suddenly and without provocation.
8. Pursuant to G.L. ch. 140, sec. 157, I find "Caesar" is a dangerous dog.

Recommendation

It is the recommendation of this Hearing Officer as follows:

1. Caesar shall be confined to the premises of John and Melissa Seaver, either securely confined indoors or outdoors in a securely enclosed fenced in area. The fenced in area shall be constructed to ensure that the dog Caesar or any dog owned by the Seavers' cannot leave the Seaver property. Within the confines of such fenced in area, a dog house or proper shelter from the elements shall be provided to protect the dog.
2. The Seavers shall have thirty (30) days from the date of this order to construct the said fenced in area and it shall be constructed to the satisfaction of Animal Control Officer Rochelle Thomson.
3. When Caesar is removed from the Seaver premises, he shall wear, in a securely and humanely manner, a Halti and training collar to be approved by the Animal Control Officer Rochelle Thomson.
4. Caesar shall not be allowed outside either on or off of the Seaver property without being on a leash.
5. If John and or Melissa Seaver are found in violation of this order, Caesar shall be subject to seizure and impoundment by the Milford Police Department and/or Animal Control Department and further Mr. and Mrs. Seaver would be ordered to immediately surrender to the Milford Town Clerk the license and tag in their possession and be prohibited from licensing a dog within the Commonwealth for five (5) years.
6. This finding shall be reported to the Milford Town Clerk in accordance with G.L. ch. 140 sec. 157(h).

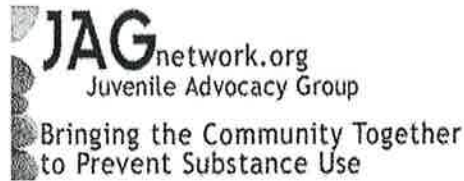
