### MINUTES OF REGULAR SESSION –DECEMBER 3, 2012

#### **ROOM O3-TOWN HALL**

#### 7:00PM

PRESENT: Chairman Brian W. Murray; Selectmen Dino B. DeBartolomeis and William D. Buckley; Town Administrator Louis J. Celozzi; and Minutes Recorder Jean M. DeTore.

- 1. Chairman Murray observed a moment of silence in memory of his uncle Dr. Joseph Murray. He stated that it was a privilege to be his nephew and noted that his medical accomplishments affected people throughout the world. He also noted that Dr. Murray always spoke highly of the education that he received in the Milford School System as well as his love of Milford.
- 2. Mr. DeBartolomeis moved, seconded by Mr. Buckley: To sign the warrant and approve the Minutes of November 19, 2012 as submitted, UNANIMOUS.
- 3. Citizen Participation None.
- 4. John P. Byrnes, Chairman of the Milford Board of Library Trustees and members Rory A. D'Alessandro and Giancarlo BonTempo were present to fill, with the Board of Selectmen, the vacancy created by the resignation of Victor R. Valenti. Chairman Murray explained the Roll Call Vote procedure and called for nominations. Mr. Byrnes moved, seconded by Mr. D'Alessandro to nominate Kate Mastroianni. Roll Call Vote: Mr. Byrnes, Mr. D'Alessandro, Mr. BonTempo, Chairman Murray, Mr. DeBartolomeis and Mr. Buckley vote in the affirmative to appoint Kate Mastroianni to the position of Library Trustee. UNANIMOUS. Ms. Kate Mastroianni is elected to fill the unexpired term of Mr. Valenti.
- 5. Town Counsel Gerald M. Moody provided an overview of the impact to school and town budgets as well as the residential bills which will result from the proposed rate increase by the Milford Water Company. He also encouraged the public, including business owners, to attend the Department of Public Utilities Public Hearing scheduled for December 12, 2012 at 7:00PM as the proposed increase will have a significant impact to their bills. He explained that the Milford Water Company will seek to prove that proposed impacts from "Revenue Deficiency" and that which they need to operate would be \$3,817,870 which signifies the 82% increase which they seek. The revenue deficiency allowed on March 1, 2011 (last rate hike)was \$1,179,579. The 82% increase would result in a \$20,000 increase to the School Department Budget and a \$40,000 increase to Town Government. The Hydrant increase would be \$437,688.79 per year. An **Average** residential bill will increase by \$21.49 per month.

Town Counsel Moody explained that the DPU Hearing is the first step followed by evidentiary hearings and discovery process. The Water Company's goal is to determine a revenue deficiency. The Board concurred with Town Counsel's presentation and urged all residents to attend the upcoming hearing.

#### 6. TOWN ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

- Monthly Financial Update I'm pleased to report that all budgets under the jurisdiction of the Board of Selectmen are on target. I would, again, like to advise the members that the Milford Youth Commission or actually the Armory facility remains problematic. On the heels of last month's expenditure of \$3,700 for condensation pumps, last week the boiler room flooded and the repair cost could approach \$1,500-\$2,000.00. This concerns me going forward as this represents a significant portion of the Maintenance Budget and we are not prepared for large expenditures for this building. It is something that should be addressed in the upcoming budget.
- <u>Painting/Masonry Projects Town Hall</u> Both projects have now been completed.
- <u>Double Poles</u> On Thursday, November 29, 2012, I met with David Mullen who had e-mailed me last month and whom I spoke with to discuss his proposal for ridding towns of Double Poles. Mr. Mullen is a retired Verizon worker currently working with Marlboro on a similar proposal. As I expected, he has developed a software program to track and identify Double Poles.

I have a packet of information for you which includes an outline of Mr. Mullen's company, a set-up page with a status update, a report listing all double poles in the town, a utility notification report, a utility status report and a remediation report.

The proposed cost for a three year contract which is "standard" would be \$20,000 in the first year for the Initial Field Survey and a maintenance fee of \$8,300 in the second and third year. If the Board has any interest in such a program, I can arrange a meeting with Mr. Mullen. As I told him, my concerns are that we have such documents and there are no guarantees contained within his proposal for the actual removal of the poles. I believe the problem is still the actual removal by National Grid even after the identifications are done.

- As the Board know, Ms. Carmen Lebron Sanchez, a long time and dedicated employee has notified us of her retirement. Her last day of work will be January 4, 2013 and retirement in February. I will be posting this position within the MACE union, per their contract.
   Depending on the movement, that will determine future postings.
- 7. Town Administrator Celozzi reviewed the proposal from David Mullen, DPR LLC, which seeks to address the Double Pole issue by simplifying and tracking the transfer process. Mr. Celozzi provided correspondence provided by Mr. Mullen outlining the program which included a cost of \$36,600 for a three year contract. Mr. Celozzi suggested that it was an impressive software program but the problem was sill convincing National Grid to commit to pole removal. The Board agreed to table the proposal. Mr. Buckley suggested inviting representatives from Comcast,

Verizon, National Grid and the Fire Department to a future meeting to discuss a commitment for removal of the double poles.

After reviewing the list of license holders with outstanding taxes provided by Tax Collector Paula Fortin , Chairman Murray suggested that the Board adhere to Article 26 of the Town of Milford General By-Laws relative to non- payment of taxes. He suggested that we provide 14 day notice to the appropriate license holders and schedule Public Hearings for January 7, 2013 to determine whether to deny, revoke, or suspend a license holder for nonpayment of taxes. Further the Board suggested that the Tax Collector provide a list of written agreements made with license holders prior to the hearings.

- 9. The Board reviewed correspondence from Michael Nicholson, Chairman of the Commission on Disability and Town Engineer Santora regarding the offer of private funding for engineering services for a proposed handicap platform at Louisa Lake. They agreed that the Louisa Lake Parking Expansion Project was their top priority at this time and wished to include this as part of the five year plan and to notify the Capital Improvement and Finance Committees of the Board's intentions. They also requested that the Commission on Disability be notified. Mr. DeBartolomeis noted that he will pursue alternate plans with the group.
- 10. Mr. DeBartolomeis moved, seconded by Mr. Buckley: To approve a permit to obstruct for the Reach the Beach Relay, Inc. for May 17 and 18, 2013 from 7:45PM-2:15AM, UNANIMOUS.
- 11. Mr. DeBartolomeis moved, seconded by Mr. Buckley: To approve a permit for the sale of Christmas Trees to Jamison Mendall Tree Removal, 235 East Main Street, December 4-December 25, 2012, Monday-Sunday 9AM-9PM, UNANIMOUS.
- 12. The Board reviewed correspondence from Atty. Walter J. Sullivan, Jr. on behalf of his client inquiring as to whether the Town of Milford is interested in a slot parlor and where it would like to see it located within the town. Chairman Murray stated that the Town of Milford currently has a Memorandum of Understanding

with Crossroads Massachusetts, LLC (David Nunes), effective until December 31, 2012 which includes an "Exclusivity Clause" which states that the town cannot entertain any other request for a gaming facility. He suggested that Atty. Sullivan and his client follow the state guidelines for pre-approval and at a later date, if feasible, return with a proposal. At this time, the Board believes there is no need for a discussion.

- 13. Mr. DeBartolomeis praised the efforts of Firefighter Ted DePaolo and the Milford Permanent Firefighters for organizing this year's spectacular Santa Parade. A letter of appreciation will be sent to them.
- 14. The Board reviewed correspondence from the Board of Assessors seeking their approval to authorize an annual stipend for Rui Pereira as a Foreign Language Translator. Town Administrator Celozzi explained that since Mr. Pereira's position is part of the MACE bargaining unit, this request would have to be bargained between MACE and the Board. After a brief discussion, the Board took the request under advisement to review the overall number of translators in Town Hall. They also requested a copy of the job description from the Personnel Board.
- 15. The Board reviewed correspondence from Lynn Lovell, Secretary of the Historical Commission of Milford requesting funding for the installation fee of \$1,100.00 for an alarm system and the yearly monitoring fee of \$250.00 per year for Memorial Hall. It was the consensus of the Board to have Town Administrator Celozzi look into the possibility of incorporating this expenditure in this fiscal year's Public Property Budget and provide a report for the next meeting.
- 16. The Board reviewed the Proposed Zoning Bylaw for the Planning Board for Medical Marijuana Treatment Centers. Town Administrator Celozzi indicated that any comments or concerns needed to be forwarded to the Town Planner as soon as possible as the Planning Board is meeting on December 11, 2012. If the by-law is approved at the Planning Board meeting, it would negate the scheduling of a Special Town Meeting.
- 17. After reviewing the Milford Youth Commission Minutes of October 22, 2012, Chairman Murray requested that Town Administrator Celozzi check with the Milford Youth Commission on the motion to amend the Milford Youth Center's Program Coordinator job description. He was concerned as to whether they followed the correct procedure to amend the position to full time if it was originally a part-time position.
