Regular Meeting Milford Board of Health March 20, 2023

At 4:43 pm Chairman Leonard Izzo Called the meeting to order.

Mike Szczepan, EL Harvey

Paul Mazzuchelli said there are only a handful of towns that have all their trash picked up on tax base. Chairman Leonard Izzo asked Daniel Syriala, Health Director to explain the trash and recycle program to Finance committee member David Levine. Michael Szczepan from EL Harvey reviewed the program for David Levine asked questions about the cost of the carts and if the town would own them after five years. Mr. Szczepan said if we took ownership of the carts, they would be the town's responsibility to maintain. David Levine said he would take the information to the committee and invite Daniel Syriala to the next Finance Committee meeting.

FY24 budget update

Daniel Syriala presented the FY24 Budget and explained the only increase besides salaries would be office supplies. Leonard Izzo made a motion to accept the budget, Kenneth Evans seconded it, and it was approved unanimously.

Tobacco regulations and violations

Daniel Syriala updated the Tobacco Regulations to meet the state requirements and the towns regulations that supersede the state. Paul Mazzuchelli made a motion to accept the regulations, Kenneth Evens seconded the motion, and it was approved unanimously.

Adopt the 2023 FDA Food Code

Kenneth Evans made a motion to adopt the 2023 FDA Food Code. Mr. Izzo said if we don't adopt the 2023 Food Code, we can't enforce it he seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

Any other issues the board would like to discuss.

Ecoatorianas Variedades, a market at 140 Main Street wants to be able to sell perishable foods again. Health Inspector Joan Clarico has had many problems with this establishment practicing proper food safety. Ms. Clarico has asked the establishment to acquire a certification in food safety from an accredited program, then come back to a meeting. Chairman Leonard Izzo said no perishable foods until they can prove knowledge of food safety.
