

Programs include: Power Protectors, Cornerstone, STEM with UMass Extension, LifeSkills with CPR. Community volunteers expressed interest in future volunteerism.

Youth Leadership Group collecting items at the front door for Humane Society.

MYC Staff no longer have access to video footage on the server. Staff discussed the new process, authorizations required and timeline for obtaining video footage. The new policy delays successful resolution of discipline issues in a timely manner.

Staff discussed the consequences of not having real-time evidence to make decisions, exercise authority, inform parents, and keep the children and staff safe.

The Town Administrator suggested trying the new policy for one month.

J. Ward will document each incidence where video footage is needed, how long it took to get the footage, and the consequences of delayed access to video footage. How many kids were out of the MYC program waiting on evidence to return to the program? What were the Police consequences with lack of video access?

### f. CORI Process Change

Only the MYC Director has authority to initiate a CORI not the Program Coordinator. Members discussed simplicity of the previous process versus the complicated process of encrypting the CORI form in email which IT is unable to resolve. MYC Staff process CORIs for 70 volunteers. Members decided HR will run all CORIs.

## 2. Building Updates:

a. Music/Multi-Purpose Media Center Discussion

The Town Accountant suggested spending down the State Grant balance of \$30,940. Members discussed using the grant to refinish wood flooring under the tiles, install of a new ceiling and soundproof the dance room.

Members discussed unresolved renovation issues. The State signed off on the \$60,000 allocation. Hold off scheduling construction until renovations are remedied.

Members discussed fundraising efforts to cover the \$60,000 State allocation in case it does not come through such as MYC Rentals from Milford softball, the Golf Tournament and possible YouthWorks funding.

J. Ward will clarify with Scott and contractors whether they will install a vapor barrier inside the Music/Multi-Purpose Media Center.

Motion: At 7:19 pm, B. Rickert moved to suspend the Regular Session and enter

into Executive Session to consider the marketing and value of Town owned property/real estate/assets because the Chair determined that an open meeting may have a detrimental effect on the negotiating position of the public body: Discussion on Behavior and Policy.

Hi Jen:

I am sorry I missed your earlier email. We understand your question to refer to the basement Storage Rm 102 below the front entrance. The exterior wall repair work is intended to occur from the exterior with interior demolition limited to the window returns. This means that interior finish installed around the three windows in that room would have to be demolished as part of the repair work. As you know, the repair is intended to stop water damage at the windows and reduce water leakage through the walls, but it will not stop water leakage through the walls. It is preferable to wait to finish that space if waiting is acceptable – the unknown is when the repair work will occur. If the waiting is not desirable, the design will have to manage the increased water leakage and risk of organic growth, and accept that the finishes at the windows will be affected by the repair when it occurs.



Without your ongoing commitment, we would not be able to deliver on our promise to provide quality programming and activities to Milford's youth—and citizens of all ages—at affordable prices.

We believe that the Youth Center is one of Milford's greatest treasures, providing a safe place for children to go after school and during the summer months, while also creating employment opportunities for teens to build their leadership skills. But we do not stop there, our goal is to create an environment where every resident can see themselves, with programs for adults during school hours and cost-effective building rentals for local residents and clubs.

2023 was an incredible year for the program, and this annual report marks the first time we have pulled together highlights, on an annual basis, to showcase the impact the program has had on the community.

# AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

We offer a 10-month, free after school for Milford residents and/or students attending Milford Public Schools, ages 8-18. The program had 632 unduplicated registered members, who were offered 2-3 structured programs a day, along with open gym, game room and a cafe/lounge. Free snacks and dinner are offered, along with use of laundry facilities.



# COMMUNITY COLLABORATIVES

The MYC is always partnering with local organizations to provide more opportunities for the youth we serve. Our expanded collaborations this year included Milford Regional Medical Center, Milford TV, Milford Town Library, Give Kids the Arts and Greenleaf Jr. Gardener Club! We also created a Social Emotional Learning Program and a Life Skills Program with a dedicated space named "Ron's Work Shop". Life Skills presentations were offered from the District Attorney's Office, National Guard and BVT Automotive Technology Program, and we partnered with GoldFish Swim School, who offered three months of free swim lessons for our Kids Play participants.



# **SUMMER CAMP**

The MYC offers an affordable, sixweek summer camp every year. Activities include weekly field trips and fun in-town activities. We had 100 families participate this year, with every camper having the option of a free breakfast and lunch. We also provided \$9,700 worth of scholarships with the generosity of local banks and organizations. The Center also served 361 free breakfasts and 909 free lunches to campers due to the collaboration of SFSP. Hockomock Area YMCA and the Milford School Food & Nutrition Services Department.



# **FOOD PROGRAMS**

W e work with our community partners and strive to best serve our members by offering supplemental food programs.

We are pleased to partner with Lovin-Spoonfuls, to provide weekend groceries to families in need, and with the Hockomock Area YMCA to offer a monthly Mobile Food Pantry.



All of our programs are 100% financed by private donations and fundraisers held throughout the year.

# Making a difference in the lives of our youth

**HOLIDAY GIFT GIVEAWAY** \$30,000 worth of gifts were distributed to over 200 youth and their families! Both the number or participants and the value of the gift donations collected increased by 50% increase over 2022.

Gifts were donated from multiple local businesses and agencies, drop of locations were established by a large number of local businesses.

**MARCH MADNESS CHAMPIONSHIPS** This month-long event hosted 15 Teams & 76 after-school participants and an additional 3-Point Contests for ages 8-12 and 13-18.

New this year, the staff thought it would be fun to have a Staff vs. MVP game. Throughout the March Madness games, staff members were watching and listening to kids on the teams who were being positive, supportive, encouraging and a great team player. Each staff nominated 1 or 2 kids to participate. It was a a close and great game against our staff team, but the staff ended up with the win!

MYC's March Madness event encouraged team participation, team spirit and overall positivity.

**THANKSGIVING DINNER** The MYC Thanksgiving Dinner, held on November 21, was a huge success! We served over 130 kids and over 50 special guests, volunteers and staff members.

An amazing array of traditional Thanksgiving food, as well as, other local cuisine provided by local restaurants was served. No one went home hungry. Leftover hot meals were provided to the Milford Fire & Police Departments

A huge number of generous local food vendors and suppliers helped to make this event possible.

**BACKPACK GIVEAWAY** Brand new backpacks, filled with pens, pencils, notebooks and virtually everything students will need to start the new school year, were distributed to 60 students!

50 of the backpacks were donated by Tri-County United Way and 11 Backpacks were donated by Hockomock YMCA.
