8. MYC Scholarship Grant Applications due 4/28; Awards Night 5/31; presented at end of year party
 - One application has been received from an applicant with no connection to MYC.
 - Ms. Stienstra will send an e-mail promotion to parents of MYC youth.
 - MYC staff can recommend youths.
 - All applications will be available for the next board meeting for a final vote.
 - Scholarship awards will be announced on Awards Night.
 - Students will receive scholarship letters and be recognized at the end-of-year party which will also promote future scholarship applications to MYC peers.

C. Directors Report:

1. After School Program:
 - a. After School Calendar and additional program fliers attached. New programs include:
 - Wayside's Art with iPads
 - The monthly Food Nutrition program began April 11.
 - The weekly Youth Council, a leadership and community service based groupMembers brainstormed ideas for an unforgettable MYC visual icon for use at events.
 - b. Attendance, dinner and snack numbers: March 2023 – see attachment
 - This is the largest attendance month due to March Madness.
 - Attendance, dinner and snacks averaged 115 kids per day in March.
 - c. School Incident and communication with schools 3/26/23 – vote to keep punishment consistent with schools

- Members discussed the successful real-life enactment of roles between the Youth Center and a School Principal as a student was suspended. Due to excellent communication, the student was not allowed to use the Youth Center until the suspension is resolved at school keeping everyone safe at the center.
- Members discussed that the Youth Center needs to know the level of risk.

2. Summer Camp registration opened on April 1st!
 - a. Purchase a water jumpy and strong dolly
 - MYC rents a water jumpy for End of Year and End of Summer parties.
 - With the Fino Field pool closed this summer and lakes polluted last summer, MYC will be renting a water jumpy much more often.
 - At a cost of \$300-\$400 per rental, it is more economical to purchase one.
 - Staff will present quotes to MYC board at the next meeting.
 - b. 20+ registrations already!
 - The Fino Field pool will not open this summer.
 - Without Goldfish Swimming in Hopkinton, we've filled up the Monday slots:
 - Connect and Inspire Nutrition
 - Steam Coding by UMass Amherst
 - Safari, Drone Exploration with Milford Special Operations
 3. Building Updates:
 - a. Renovation litigation: Outside work started April 3, 2023
 - Chair Rickert thanked Jay Vaz for overseeing the work.
 - They tested for water infiltration by letting water run through hoses placed inside the building.
 - They neglected to place a receptacle inside the building to collect the water.
 - b. Music/Multipurpose Media Center – Bid results- see attachment
 - i. Lessen scope – budget?
 - Lessen the project scope, but the space would be inadequate.
 - ii. Request to State Rep. Brian Murray for earmark
 - MYC hoped the bid would be \$75,000; the lowest bid was \$135,000.
 - Ask State Rep, Brian Murray to earmark \$65,000 to make up the difference.
 - If MYC secures the State difference, we pass over Town Meeting Article.
 - iii. Town Meeting Warrant for difference
 - Milford Youth Center added an article to the Town Meeting Warrant.
- Members discussed which proceeds comprise the \$75,000 in MYC's account.

- c. HVAC project in progress –Health Foundation of Central Massachusetts Meeting grant for \$115,250.00 – midyear report emailed 3/31/23
 - They will send second grant installment.
 - We have cages to protect gas heaters.
 - Jay Vaz is overseeing the project so they fix what they damaged.

 - b. YouthWorks Grant budget submitted:
 - i. Tier 2: \$16.25/hr: Goal 20 students – entry level placements
 - MYC will get \$200,000 for the summer; we will purchase ChromeBooks.
 - ii. Tier 3: \$17.50/hr: Goal 10 students returning and good career fit path
 - iii. Tier 4: \$18.75/hr: Goal 3-5 participants with potential further employment after summer

Promote that MYC has air conditioning to increase summer rentals.

 - MYC Staff, Joanne Abrantes, Emily Stienstra, Jen Ward and additional staff and kids from the Youth Council as well as parents, will meet at 9:00 am with equipment, coffee and donuts to start.
 - The Lions Clubs will conclude the event with hamburgers.
 - c. YMCA Golf Tourney – Friday, May 5, 2023 (Cinco de Mayo) – summer camp scholarships
 - Jen Ward will meet with Pat from the YMCA to make the packages.
 - Jen will award prizes for winners before her vacation.
 - Darlene and John Dulude will spray paint boxes for raffle prizes (either the golf event or the September event).
 - d. CraftRoots Fundraiser - Friday, September 15, 2023 – Free Afterschool programming
- 6. Rentals:

 - Emily Stienstra presented ideas for the Gym:
 - Hold at October event but advertise now before summer
 - Run volleyball and pickleball 3 days weekly
 - MYC will not provide lessons (participants have to know how to play)
 - \$5 Town residents; \$8 out of Town residents; \$3 per paddle, balls provided
 - Offer Adult Gym on Tuesday and Wednesday during the summer.
 - Boxing rental:

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- MYC developed a rate structure
- They are looking to do a huge fundraiser with alcohol.
- They would need to present to the MYC Board then the Town for approval.
